

Develop your employability and entrepreneurial skills whilst studying.

GRADUATION CEREMONY



At the end of your HE programme, graduating students are invited to take part in a graduation ceremony in celebration of their achievements. Full details will be made available to students once they complete their course.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR HIGHER EDUCATION [©]

Government financial support is available through loans, which have to be paid back and grants and bursaries that don't. Some student financial support depends upon your household income - that is, the income of your parents or your husband, wife or partner.

Tuition Fee Loan

You can get a Tuition Fee Loan to cover tuition fees. Loan repayments start the April after leaving university and once earnings exceed £25,000 a year.

Tuition fees are paid directly to the College in three instalments.

The City of Liverpool College University Centre's tuition fees are set as follows:

- Full time fees: these range from £6,700 to £8,450
- Part time fees: these range from £3,350 to £5,607

Maintenance Loan

- The maximum maintenance support for students from low income households living away from home and studying outside London will be £9,978 a year.
- The maximum maintenance support for new students entitled to benefits living away from home and studying outside London will be £11,374 a year.
- Maintenance loans replace special support grants for new full-time students who are entitled to welfare benefits.

You have to pay it back but not until you finish or leave your course and your income is over £25,000 a year.

COLLEGE BURSARIES 🔒



The City of Liverpool College University Centre Bursary

Full time student eligibility criteria:

- has a household income up to £25,000
- is in receipt of any of the following grants/ allowances: Special Support Element of the Maintenance Loan; Parents' Learning Allowance: Childcare Grant: Disabled Students' Allowance.

Part time student eligibility criteria:

- has a household income up to £25,000
- is in receipt of the following grants/welfare benefits: Disabled Students' Allowance; Jobseeker's Allowance; Income Support; Employment and Support Allowance; Carer's Allowance.

The following students will be eligible for this support regardless of household income: care leavers; young adult carers; young people estranged from their family; people from Gypsy Roma & Traveller communities; refugees; children from military families.

Note: Students fully funded by their employer or sponsor (excluding Student Finance England) are not eligible for this support.





HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE IN ART AND DESIGN (FASHION AND TEXTILES)

ABOUT THE COURSE

The Higher National Certificate in Art and Design (Fashion and Textiles) is a one-year course designed to equip students with a wide range of technical and creative skills relevant to progression onto the Level 5 Higher National Diploma Top-Up or for a variety of creative career pathways in industry.

The course provides students with an opportunity to master the skills and techniques of their chosen specialism and develop higher level skills to meet the skills shortages within the Fashion industry. Students will broaden their experience and depth of knowledge, allowing them to develop skills and attributes essential for a career in the fashion sector.

The knowledge and skills acquired on the programme link directly to the vocational context and will diversify into a range of practical and technical skills required by the specialist industries. These include (but are not exclusive to): creative and conceptual tailoring; fashion

design; traditional and contemporary illustration; traditional and innovative garment production techniques; and business and enterprise competence.

The course is highly creative and designed to equip you with the skills needed to work within the many facets of the fashion and textile design industry. Strong links to the creative industries will facilitate industry-related briefs and real scenarios that provide an opportunity for you to acquire professional work ethics, time planning skills and working within a creative team.

WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY?

For this particular programme, the following will apply:

- Level 3 Extended Diploma in a relevant subject (MMM minimum) or A-level qualifications in a relevant subject area or equivalent level 3 qualification
- GCSE English Language and GCSE Maths at grade C/4 or above or equivalent.

All applicants are interviewed and are asked to submit a portfolio of work.

We also welcome applications from those with relevant experience in lieu of the minimum entry requirements. If you are a mature student and you can demonstrate experience and skills needed for our HE courses – from current work and/or through other skills or experience – this can supplement your application.

BA (HONS) MUSIC (POPULAR & PRODUCTION PATHWAYS) (TOP-UP)

ABOUT THE COURSE

The BA (Hons) Music (Popular and Production pathways) (Top-Up) course is a direct progression route for students successfully completing the Higher National Diploma in Music or Music Production, or similar Level 5 programme at the College or elsewhere. The course equips students to become multi-skilled music practitioners/producers, and studying at The City of Liverpool College University Centre hones students' creativity, with an innovative and supportive BA (Hons) (Top-Up) programme to fulfil their dreams and aspirations of working in the music industry.

Technology modules are taught using industry standard equipment, and all modules are delivered by lecturers who have had long-standing careers in the industry to the present day. Their experience stretches over decades, including live sound, ensemble performance, professional bands, recording studios, record labels, DJing, audio post production and entrepreneurial industry skills.

Much of the top-up year is project based, and students select options for their pathway into the industry. The core modules include a combination of academia and practical skills focused on professionalism and employability. The generic modules investigate the current music industry and the place of music in contemporary culture and professional development. They are completed in conjunction with specialist pathway modules, for students to apply their individual skills to projects to give an invaluable experience at Level 6.

Specialist options within the two pathways include performance, composition/songwriting, research, recording studio/audio production and composing sound for film/TV/games.

A key feature of the programme is work-related learning, not only in the area of employability but also self-employment, enterprise and entrepreneurship. FOUNDATION DEGREE IN DENTAL TECHNOLOGY

ABOUT THE COURSE

The Foundation Degree in Dental Technology is a three-year, part-time course that has been developed and built to match the requirements of dental technicians, employers, professional bodies, and also meet the statutory regulator's requirements for recognition of the higher technical skills required by modern dental technicians. These are steps needed to gain the knowledge, understanding and competence students will require to develop as a Dental Care Professional (DCP).

The Foundation Degree recognises the practical skills training provided by a 'workplace mentor' in one of the disciplines of dental technology, and formal credit will be given for the developed competence and integration with other members of the dental team.

This programme is intended to provide students with an opportunity to develop the knowledge, understanding and real work-based competence to effectively operate as a dental technician and also to register with the General Dental Council (GDC) as a dental technician.



FOUNDATION DEGREE IN EARLY YEARS PRACTICE

ABOUT THE COURSE

The Foundation Degree in Early Years Practice is a full-time qualification which provides students with the specialist knowledge and skills required within the Early Years sector.

This level 4/5 qualification has been developed in collaboration with Early Years' employers, LJMU and other partner colleges.

Work-based learning is a key part of students' learning. Students will use their workplace, including a chosen mentor and everyday duties, as a key learning resource throughout the programme.

Successful completion of the foundation degree may lead to increased promotion opportunities within the Early Years workforce and may also lead to the ability to work at a level recognised by employers as Senior Practitioner.

Achievement of the Foundation Degree also allows progression to the BA (Hons) Early Childhood Studies (Top-Up) Level 6 programme at The City of Liverpool College University Centre.

The BA (Hons) Early Childhood Studies (Top-Up) is a one-year full time higher education qualification for experienced Early Years practitioners who have successfully completed a Foundation Degree in Early Years Practice or equivalent Level 5 qualification and who want to progress into further responsibility within the Early Years sector or postgraduate study to switch careers.

- Certificate in Education applicants students should have a qualification at Level 3 or above in the area that they teach (e.g. A-levels; HNC; HND; NVQ Level 3-4), and relevant work experience
- Professional Graduate Certificate in Education applicants - students should hold a UK first degree or equivalent and relevant work experience, where appropriate to the subject. Students should also hold a qualification at Level 3 or above in the subject area they teach in, if this is different from that of their degree
- Postgraduate Certificate/Postgraduate
 Diploma in Education applicants –
 students should hold a UK first degree
 at 2:1 or above or equivalent and relevant
 work experience, where appropriate to
 the subject. Students should also hold
 a qualification at Level 3 or above in the
 subject area they teach in, if this is different
 from that of their degree.


Students should normally be in employment as a teacher or trainer at a recognised training or educational establishment for a minimum of 150 hours (at least 75 hours in any one year). Voluntary teaching/training may be acceptable in some circumstances.

In addition, students must:

- Provide Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check and health clearances
- Provide two satisfactory references
- Complete a satisfactory interview
- Identify a work-based mentor who can support you in their subject specialism.

For any students requiring a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, the associated cost will be approximately £52.

OTHER PROFESSIONAL COURSES


The City of Liverpool College also offers a range of professional qualifications and Higher Apprenticeships at Level 4 and above. These may be of interest to applicants wishing to develop their knowledge and skills in their current workplace or prepare for their future careers.

Have a look at the following examples:

- Intermediate Certificate in Human Resource Management (level 5): This course is designed for anyone seeking to develop a career in Human Resources and enables students to extend their knowledge and skills, or develop responsibility for implementing Human Resources policies and strategies.
- NCTJ Diploma in Journalism (level 5): The NCTJ course is ideal for anyone considering a career
 in journalism. Students will learn essential skills required in the industry, including shorthand,
 media law and public affairs. Students will undertake placements in a local media outlet and
 gain insight from leading industry professionals.

HIGHER LEVEL QUALIFICATIONS EXPLAINED

FRAMEWORK FOR HIGHER EDUCATION QUALIFICATIONS (FHEQ)

The Framework for Higher Education Qualifications (FHEQ) has been designed by the higher education sector and describes all main higher education qualifications.

FOUNDATION DEGREE

A foundation degree is a level 5 qualification - broadly equivalent to the first two years of a degree level programme - that combines academic study and work-based learning. It is specifically designed to give you the skills and knowledge needed to progress to a full Bachelor's degree. If you are unsure of your skill levels can take a foundation degree before progressing on to a full degree programme.

HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATES (HNCS) AND HIGHER NATIONAL DIPLOMAS (HNDS)

If you want to gain a recognised higher level qualification and develop your skills and knowledge to do a specific job, a HNC or HND could be for you. HNCs and HNDs are known to focus on 'learning by doing' and can prepare you for a new career, or help you to progress in your current job.

HNCs and HNDs are provided by over 400 universities and further education colleges. HNCs can be completed in one year full time and over two years part time.

Typically the College offers HNDs over two years, where students study a HNC in the first year, and a HND Top-Up in the second year.

HONOURS DEGREE

An Honours degree normally requires 3 years full time study to complete, but it can also be taken part time. The final year will involve the production of a dissertation.

TOP-UP DEGREE

A Top-Up degree is equivalent to the final year of BA (Hons) or BSc (Hons) degree, giving you a Bachelor's-level qualification. These courses enable you to 'top-up' an existing qualification such as a Foundation degree or Higher National Diploma (HND).

HIGHER VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Higher vocational qualifications cover a wide range of careers and come in five different qualification types. The College has an exceptional range of higher education professional - including work based - qualifications.

These programmes allow the flexibility to work and study at the same time, giving students, employers and employees the option to efficiently develop and nurture skills within the workplace.

The qualifications involve several different course-related elements/units involving a combination of classroom-based learning and/or workplace assessment.

The College provides industry standard facilities and outstanding tutors to ensure you get the very best experience from your chosen programme.

Higher education work-based learning programmes vary in duration but will typically cover a twelve to twenty-four month period.



The universities validate several of the Foundation Degrees, Honours and Top-Up degrees as well as a suite of initial teacher education programmes up to Master's level. The College's Higher National qualifications are awarded by Pearson.

Many of our courses have clearly mapped out progression opportunities at the University Centre for those who wish to top up to an Honours degree or teacher training.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All students who are non-native English speakers and who have not undertaken their final two years of schooling in English, can demonstrate capability in English at a standard equivalent to the levels identified below, before being recruited to the programme where the programme is both taught and assessed in English:

- Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) level B2
- PTE51
- IELTS 5.5; Reading and Writing must be at 5.5
- or equivalent.





UNIVERSITY CENTRE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The College uses UCAS tariff points to standardise entry requirements and make it easier to compare applicants for courses. Therefore, after converting qualifications achieved, applicants should hold a total tariff score for all relevant qualifications of at least 96 points.

It is expected that all applicants will hold relevant Level 2 maths and English qualifications, equivalent to GCSE grade C/4 or above.

Mature students: The University Centre welcomes applications from mature students who have relevant experience in lieu of the minimum entry requirements.

Mature students (over 21) without formal qualifications may be accepted subject to satisfactory literacy and numeracy tests, work experience (if applicable) and a strong personal statement.

Recognition of Prior Learning: Applicants may meet entry requirements through the process of Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), which awards academic credits through recognition of prior learning via work and other life experiences.

Recognition of Prior Learning is either certificated (RPCL) through formal assessment, or Experiential (RPEL) via skills and knowledge developed through work and voluntary activities.
